DOUBLE MASTER EUROPEAN FINANCIAL MARKETS AND INSTITUTIONS

Two-year programme (M1 & M2) available for B.Sc. and B.A. graduates

The University of Angers conjointly with the University of Leipzig offer a Double Master European Financial Markets and Institutions. The programme is co-funded by the *Universität franco-allemande/Deutsch-französische Hochschule*. Its students benefit from a monthly *UFA/DFH* stipend.

The programme covers the historical development of financial markets and institutions, the working of financial instruments, legal aspects of financial markets, financial market regulation as well as the interaction of financial markets with economic policy, monetary policy, and sustainability. It is interdisciplinary with a focus on economics, business administration, law, and economic history.

The programme prepares students for a career in banking and finance, public administrations, supervisory and regulatory agencies, as well as in European institutions such as the European Commission, the European Central Bank, or the European Stability Mechanism.

Classes are taught by renowned academics and professionals from both countries. Students will be trained in the autonomous use of economic analysis and obtain an in-depth knowledge of modern financial markets, particularly in the context of the European integration process.

While the programme is designed to prepare for professional careers, students may also choose to follow up with interdisciplinary doctoral studies at the crossroads of law, economics, and finance.

— Structure

The Double Master European Financial Markets and Institutions is a two-year programme within the Bologna system (M1 and M2).

On the **M1 level**, students attend the Master European Financial Markets and Institutions at the University of Leipzig. All classes are taught in English. Optional fields are offered in German. The common core consists of the following modules: Financial Market Regulation (10 ECTS) and Development of Financial Markets and Institutions (10 ECTS) and International Economic Policy (10 ECTS). Among the optional courses (selection): Sustainable Finance (5 ECTS), Corporate Finance (10 ECTS), Theorien der Finanzintermediation (10 ECTS), Banking and Financial Law (5 ECTS), Time Series Analysis (10 ECTS), Advanced Macroeconomics (10 ECTS), Wertpapiermanagement (10 ECTS).

On the **M2 level**, students follow the Master Law & Finance at the University of Angers. All classes are taught in English. Optional courses are offered in French. In addition, each student must write a Master's thesis (14 ECTS). The common core consists of the following modules: Corporate Finance (12 ECTS), Financial Regulation (16 ECTS), Law and Economics (14 ECTS). Optional courses: International Financial Business Game (2 ECTS), Conjoncture et marchés financiers (2 ECTS), Economics of Financial Risks (2 ECTS) and Capital investissement (2 ECTS).

At the end of the two years, all student who have obtained 120 ECTS will graduate with two Master degrees: Master Finance, parcours Law & Finance (Université d'Angers) and M. Sc. European Financial Markets and Institutions (Universität Leipzig).

— Admission Requirements

To enter the programme, candidates must have graduated with an honours bachelor degree, or equivalent, in economics, business, finance, or law. Double-majors in law and economics or in law and finance are strongly encouraged to apply. Candidates from the US should have a B.A. or a B.Sc. degree. Other candidates may qualify if they have equivalent degrees (Bachelor's Degree) or substantial professional experience in law or finance.

Students with foreign degrees may also apply.

Attention: this Double Master is currently **not open to foreign students living in countries with a Campus France procedure**, due to inconsistent recruitment schedules.

The programme is available for full-time study. We are currently unable to accommodate part-time students.

— Admission Process

To apply and know all the dates of the admission process, **scan the QR code** on the front of this sheet to access the **Double Master webpage**, then refer to the **Admission** section.

Applications can be submitted from **early November to late May**.

Early applications are encouraged to benefit from additional **Erasmus funding opportunities**.

Early candidates should submit an **Erasmus+ application package** by the **end of February / beginning of March**.

All other candidates submit a **regular application package** by the **end of May**.

Each application should include a full and detailed CV, transcripts, at least one letter of recommendation, and a letter of motivation. Citizens of Anglo-Saxon countries do not have to provide evidence of language proficiency. All others need to submit TOIC or TOEFL scores.

An **Erasmus+ pre-selection** is carried out in **March**.

All **other applications** are considered at the **end of May**.

Successful applicants are invited to a **first audition** in English in **early June**.

At the end of this pre-selection, **eligible applicants** are invited to a **second audition** in English around **mid-June**, which take place by videoconference with a joint selection committee at the universities of Angers and Leipzig.

Final admissions are announced by the **end of June**.

— Tuition Fees

EU and non-EU students only have to pay usual **national tuition fees** (about 250 €) as well as **Student Life and Campus Contribution** (CVEC, about 100 €).

All international students are entitled to health insurance.

The "Assurance Maladie" (French Social Security) provides all international students with free health insurance. It can cover up to 70% of healthcare expenses.

Non-EU students and students without a European Health Insurance Card (EHIC) must register on the Health Insurance website **etudiant-etranger.ameli.fr** (choose your language). This is compulsory and free of charge. European students with a CEAM card and Erasmus exchange students do not need to register online.
